You'll learn how to support people to feel more connected and open when they come together and how and when to intervene to help a group work well.

The two-day workshop is packed with ideas and opportunities to practice and will open you up to a new way of working with groups. You'll leave feeling confident to work with your community and excited about what you can achieve together.

The workshop will cover:

- Forming group agreements
- · Helping a group to work well together
- Using microskills to facilitate with confidence
- Developing your own self-awareness as a facilitator
- · Reading the energy of a group
- Managing conflict and other tricky situations
- Knowing when to intervene to help the group get back on track
